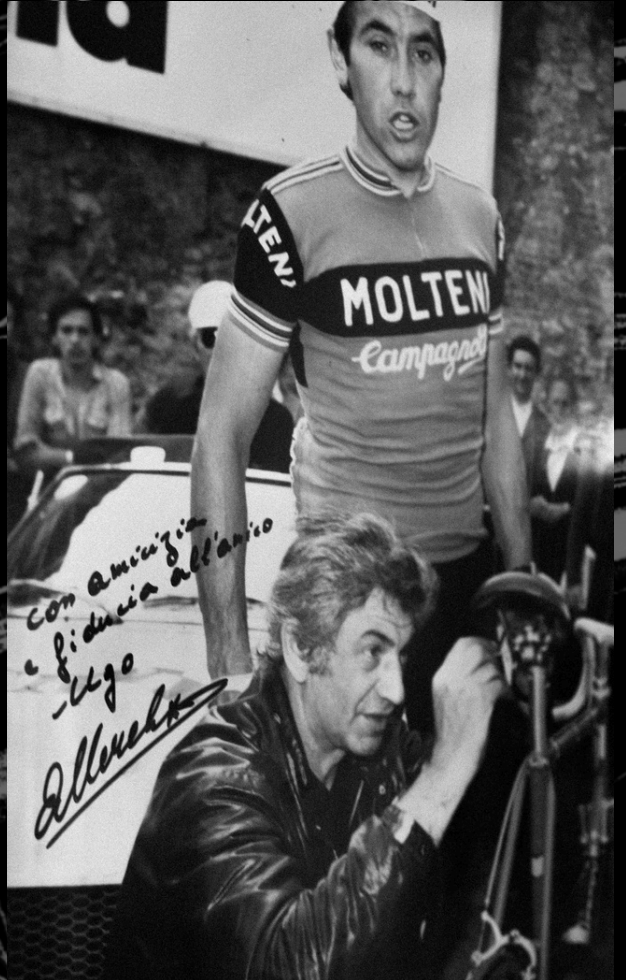



Design, style, and building philosophy

The De Rosa 70's design comes from a clear philosophy: it blends form and function, performance and aesthetics, as well as tradition and innovation.

You can see this approach reflected in many aspects of the bike. The aesthetics were carefully crafted in collaboration with Pininfarina, a name that represents excellence in Made in Italy design around the globe. In fact, the 70 showcases sleek lines that draw inspiration from that realm.

The chassis features a mix of smooth, aerodynamic curves that slice through the air effortlessly, along with tighter, sharper lines to minimize turbulence, resulting in a visually harmonious design.

Stylistically, it blends classic elements with futuristic touches. One standout characteristic is the head tube: when you look at it from the front, it seems nearly flat because there are no sharp edges and the headset and stem are fully integrated. This aerodynamic design enhances airflow, preventing any disruptions.

The seat post blends seamlessly with the shape of the seat tube, the closure is concealed, and the clamp is out of sight.

The wheel arch is shaped just right to keep aerodynamic efficiency in check, while still being spacious enough to accommodate modern styles and provide flexibility.

The carbon finish is also a key element of the design, serving as a visual cue of the advanced material lying just below the surface.

It's not only a sight to behold; it also helps reduce weight wherever it can, placing the heavier 12K only at areas of maximum structural stress, like the bottom bracket, while using lighter fibers on the main tubes.

The 70 might just be the best representation of the modern De Rosa philosophy: "evolution within tradition." It's all about taking the rich experience built up over 70 years and tailoring it to what today's cyclists need.

70 is where tradition and the future finally stop clashing.

It's a project that started in the mind but was ultimately decided with the heart.

The concept is that a flagship product doesn't need to "satisfy everyone"; it just needs to be consistent, recognizable, and accurate.

Cycling is evolving: bikes are quicker, more connected, more advanced, and more extreme. But in this rush for stats, the best aspect—the sensation, the character—often gets overlooked. It's all about the joy of riding something that feels unique, not just replicated, but thoughtfully crafted.

We were looking for a modern bike—something aerodynamic, lightweight, and stiff—but it had to look like a De Rosa right from the start, especially with that first pedal stroke.

When a project is like this, it can't just come to life in the workshop.

What we really need is an honest conversation between the people who have been making bicycles for years and those who understand how to turn function into style.


This is where the partnership with Pininfarina kicks off once more.

Construction kicked off in 2021 and took 22 months to complete, with every detail being meticulously attended to.

You might not be aware, but back in 2021, we initially thought we were just giving the SK Pininfarina a makeover. However, as we dove deeper into the project, it became clear that it was evolving into something entirely unique. Gradually, it turned into a tribute to both the brand's craftsmanship and the latest in technological advancements.

While we were developing the bike, we teamed up with Pininfarina to create eight prototypes. This process helped us test and fine-tune the bike step by step.

We've really focused on the design and geometry of the rear triangle, making several tweaks to enhance performance and handling while still keeping the original look intact.



Just one step away from launching, we hit the brakes.

The back end isn't quite what we envisioned yet. It needs another review. It's either this or nothing gets done.

We're all set to ditch the project, but we made a promise to ourselves: no compromises.

Now, let's shut our eyes and gently run a finger along the whole surface of the frame.

The head tube is designed without any sharp edges, which helps maintain smooth aerodynamic flow.

A gentle form, a "cradle" that embraces and seamlessly incorporates all the cables.

The look is sleek, and the front impact is sharp: zero offset.

The horizontal tube runs in a straight line, has a slight slope, and forms a perfect proportion with the seat tube of a superbike: hexagonal, sharp, and ready to slice through the wind.

But the true revolution lies in the chariot, a genuine masterpiece of skill and expertise.

The angles are striking, the weight stays light, and the air moves freely.

We head down to the bottom bracket shell, curvy and sleek.

It's both futuristic and solid at once.



70 - Technical specifications

High-modulus carbon fiber monocoque chassis.

The frame comes in at only 730 grams (size 54), which makes it one of the lightest aero bikes available. The matching full-carbon fork tips the scales at just 280 grams and is crafted for stability and precise steering.

Pureblood racing design.

The overall profile has a gentle slope: the angled top tube brings down the center of gravity and highlights the out-of-seat area, which helps cut down on weight and gives it a more aggressive appearance.

The low stack and noticeable reach result in a compact and aerodynamic riding stance.

The rear triangle is 405 mm across all sizes, which is a short measurement that enhances responsiveness during acceleration.


The angle of the seat tube changes with the size, but it always stays vertical enough to make pedaling more efficient.

Every part of the frame is crafted with aerodynamics in focus. The head tube features a tapered design and smooth edges, giving it a sleek appearance and an aerodynamic edge with no offset.

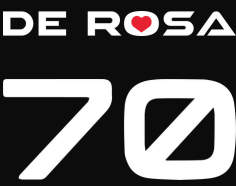
The air meets a sleek front end and flows smoothly along the frame without any interruptions. Even the fork and seat stays are shaped like blades, designed to direct the airflow toward the rear wheel and allow it to exit quickly with little turbulence.

Even with its sleek, aerodynamic design, the bike still offers a level of vertical comfort: the seat stays are slim and flattened, allowing for just the right amount of flex to absorb vibrations.

The seatpost is designed without any setback to enhance pedaling efficiency. The seatpost clamp is built into the frame, keeping it out of sight.

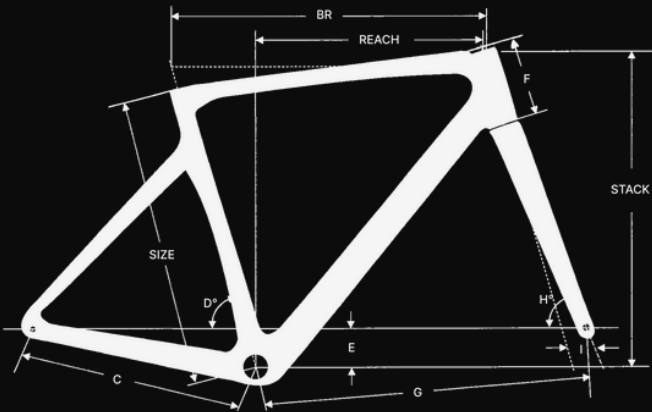

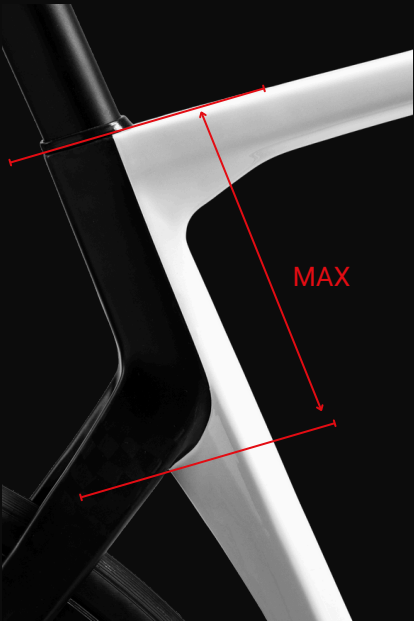

Professional insights

Experts and insiders all seem to agree that the De Rosa 70 is quite an impressive bike, not just for its technical features but also for what it stands for.

Simon Smythe, a journalist with Rouleur, described it as "the most Italian bike of the bunch" at the Giro d'Italia, highlighting its all-Italian design and inherent elegance. In that light, the Campagnolo-equipped 70 generated excitement among fans who cherish Made in Italy, with Smythe noting, "exactly what Campagnolo enthusiasts were missing this year."

On the BiciDaStrada.it pages, the editorial team highlighted how this model perfectly combines passion and technology in a way that's rare to find: "Lightweight and tech, no compromises. Pure rigidity, top-notch performance. Aerodynamics, classically swift," which feels like a poetic nod to De Rosa's stated construction philosophy.

A bunch of international influencers—from Britain's GCN Tech to the German bloggers at RennRad—have featured the De Rosa 70 in their top bike lists for 2023, often highlighting the perfect mix of tradition and innovation.

Marco Saligari, who used to be a pro and is now a TV commentator, saw a Bardiani rider break away during a Giro stage and said live, "This De Rosa is flying, and her rider is flying with her," hinting at how the bike might boost performance. While the athlete's skill is key, it's noteworthy that seasoned experts picked up on the bike's quality right away.



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
